**Paine Field Continues to Add Convenience for Seattle Travelers with New Nonstop Service to Boise on Alaska Airlines**

SEATTLE (February 6, 2020) — The passenger terminal at Paine Field, recently named one of *USA Today's* top 10 best small airports, added to its extensive nonstop flight map to western US hub cities today with service from Everett to Boise, ID beginning on June 18. The newest route, operated by Alaska Airlines' sister carrier Horizon Air, comes nearly a year into Paine Field's tenure as the go-to travel option for business and leisure travelers in the Puget Sound region.

"A growing number of our guests enjoy the ease of flying to and from Paine Field and its new terminal.
